LOGOS SCHOOL SECOND SEMESTER ELECTIVES 2015-16

Annual – Mrs. Spencer (15 students) – In this class, students will produce the Logos Annual using the yearbook software online. The school has a limited number of computers for student use. It is preferable that students use their own laptop with wireless capability. There are a limited number of digital cameras owned by the school if a student does not have access to one. The first semester of Annual (from any year) is a prerequisite to this class.

Chorus – Mr. Erber – (*Required for JH students with last names that start with A-L in the fall and M-Z in the spring.* Open to HS students as well.) – We will be preparing a variety of musical pieces for several performance opportunities. We will also be building upon our knowledge of music theory and history as we seek to glorify God in all we sing.

Conditioning – Mr. Holloway (30 students, 8th-12th grade boys) – This class focuses on improving the strength and quickness of our high school athletes. Class begins at 8:00 AM and uses a number of stations in the weight room and gym.

Digital Photography – Lisa Hughes (\$15 materials fee) – This is a beginner's class in basic photography. Students will study and learn to differentiate photographic genres, practice techniques, and consider how they might use photography to affect our culture. There will be one digital assignment due each week with all images being critiqued in class. Students will come away knowing the essential workflow of the creative process, and have the technical knowledge to execute their vision in this increasingly powerful medium. Each student will need their own digital camera (not a cellphone camera), and the ability to turn in their photographs via email.

Domestic Arts – Mrs. Wintz (15 students, 9^{th} -12th grade girls) – This class will focus on the art and science of homemaking. Some topics that will be covered are cooking, family finances, home care and cleaning, hospitality, interior design, and more (\$10 materials fee).

Geography – Mrs. Courtney (open to 26 students who have successfully completed 8^{th} grade geography) – This class will focus on the history, culture, tourism, economics, current events, and religious issues of a wide variety of countries around the world. Come ready to research, learn and present!

Internship – Mrs. Merkle (seniors only) – Seniors should refer to the Senior Course Options information packet (logosschool.com) for more information on this elective option. This elective does not meet during the normal elective times.

Keyboarding – Mrs. Belschner (15 students) – This is a beginning typing course. It is highly recommended for junior high school students and others who cannot type.

Latin Tutor – Miss Larsen – This elective is for new students who are beginning their Latin studies as well as more experienced students who need additional instruction and practice in order to be successful in their current Latin class.

Roadster Shop – Mr. Jacobs & Mr. Erber (9th-12th grade boys, 6 students, \$35 materials fee) – Using <u>Build Your Own</u> <u>Sports Car</u> by Ron Champion as a guide, we will practice welding, and weld the space frame together and start bolting the salvaged pieces on to it. Watercolor/Pastels – Mr. Garfield (16 students, \$25 materials fee) – This will be a multi-media class: students may choose either watercolor or pastels for painting. Less experienced students will switch up for the fourth quarter to become familiar with both mediums. As with any studio class, it will be expected that the students may not necessarily have great talent, but they must have a strong work ethic.
