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Logos Leads with the Gospel

It's one thing to say that the gospel is central. It's another thing entirely to make it so. So how does Logos School ensure that we are not merely talking a lot about the gospel but actually applying it and living it?

First, we look the danger of Christian education squarely in the face. The danger is Pharisaism, hypocrisy, and inoculation. Pharisees draw near to God with their lips, but their hearts are far from Him (Is. 29:13). They cleanse the outside of the cup with slick arguments and SAT scores, but they are whitewashed tombs and inside is all manner of uncleanness and dead men's bones. Ultimately, this kind of self-deception is self-justifying and therefore a devious inoculation to the gospel. Everything is decorated with gospelese and Godwords such that the sword of the Spirit may be easily deflected. Rather than setting them free, to live as bold and joyful Christian men and women, the "truth" in mere words makes them resistant to the truth. The first sign of great hope at Logos School is an administration, teaching staff, and board that are fully aware of these dangers, and prayerfully committed to fighting against them.

Second, and very much related, Logos School is committed to fighting sin when it is small. Pharisees do not appear out of nowhere. Christian schools do not produce hypocrites randomly. While we recognize parents and family culture as even more significant in the long-term

In Psalm 19 David wonders over the blazing glory of creation and God's word and this leads him very naturally to ponder the mystery of sin. He recognizes three sorts of sins: secret sins (sins he can't see), presumptuous sins, and great transgressions (Ps. 19:11-13). David says that if God will cleanse him of the secret sins and give him the grace to fight the presumptuous sins, then he will not fall into the great transgressions. 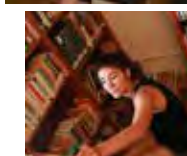

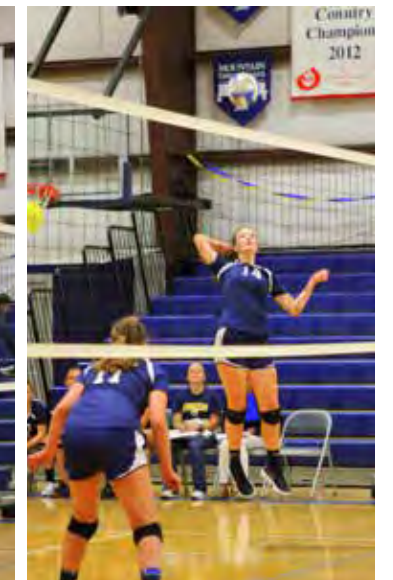
first two matches and tying for 7th place. Though they didn't do as well as they would have liked, they remained thankful to God for an excellent season and a chance to go to state.

KANSAS CITY, Mo. - After garnering Frontier Conference Runner of the Week recognition earlier this week, Lewis-Clark State men's cross country senior Jonny Handel has been named the NAIA National Men's Cross Country Runner of the Week, the national office announced Wednesday, September 5, 2018.

Handel led No. 4 LCSC to a fifth-place overall finish at the Clash of the Inland Northwest, hosted by the University of Idaho. The Warriors were the top non-D-I program at the meet, and Handel posted the best non-D-I finish, coming in 35th with one of the fastest times in school history (18:17.0) in the highly competitive field of 89. Handel ran during his prep years at Logos High of Moscow.

"We are excited about Jonny being recognized nationally," Warriors coach Mike Collins said. "He is the epitome of hard work paying off. "He has definitely earned the recognition he has received for himself and the positive aspect that it brings to the program as he has become part of a line of national weekly honor recipients at LCSC. The fact that he is an Idaho native is even better."
