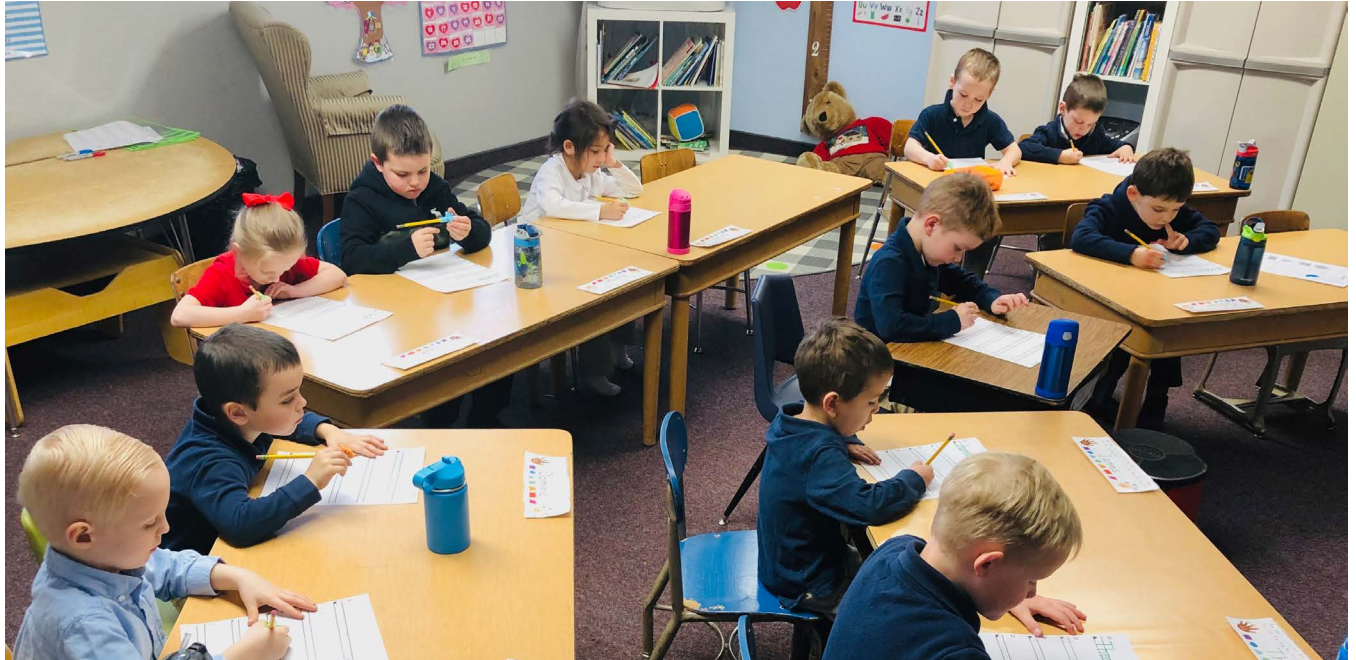

The School District Model

To make room for more students, Logos preschool and kindergarten have been meeting in classrooms at a local church. As enrollment steadily increases, the new school district model will help provide classical Christ-centered education to a growing number of students for years to come.

For a number of years, the long-term vision for the growth of Logos School, as it was held by the Logos School board, was to limit our growth to two classes per grade level, K–12.

This would put an upper limit of our total enrollment at somewhere between 500 and 600 students (depending on the sizes of individual classes). It was the conviction of the board (and remains our conviction) that for our school to grow any larger than this would result in the depersonalization of the education we offer, which is another way of contradicting the kind of education we seek to offer. This conviction also set the architectural limits and constraints for our building project on the northeast side of Moscow.

As the result of a recent board meeting (May 27, 2020), we have altered our strategic plan for our growth, but in a way that maintains our commitment for a truly personal and truly Christian education of our students. This decision was brought about as we considered the ramifications of a

significant migration of many Christian families to Moscow, with many more anticipated, coupled with the current size of our waiting pool.

Our new model for accommodating our anticipated growth is the formation of a Logos School District. To give a picture of what this could look like, we would like you to imagine how the school district would look ten years from now. Our new facilities off Mountain View would be the secondary school (7–12), able to accommodate between 500 and 600 students. Our current facility on Baker Street would be one of our elementary schools. We would also be operating one or two other elementary schools from other locations in Moscow. These schools would be the feeder schools for the secondary school, and the enrollment of these schools would be maintained in such a way as to ensure that the secondary school would be able to accept all students coming from those schools. ⊕

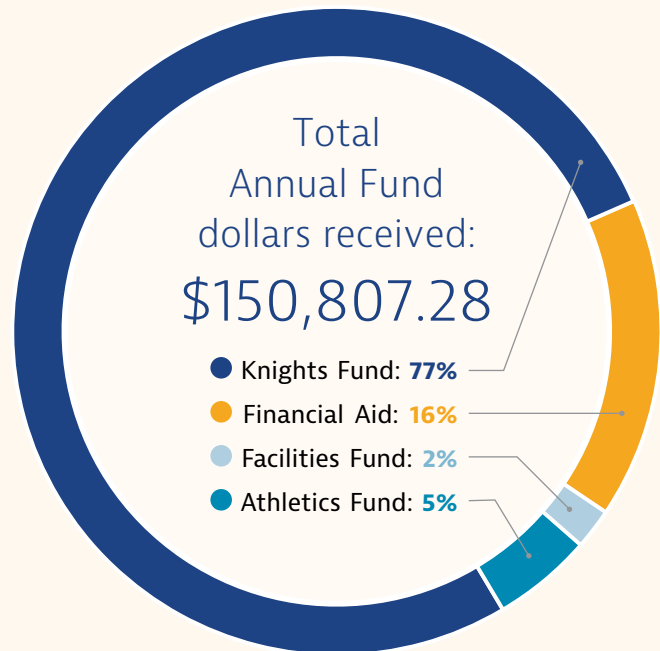

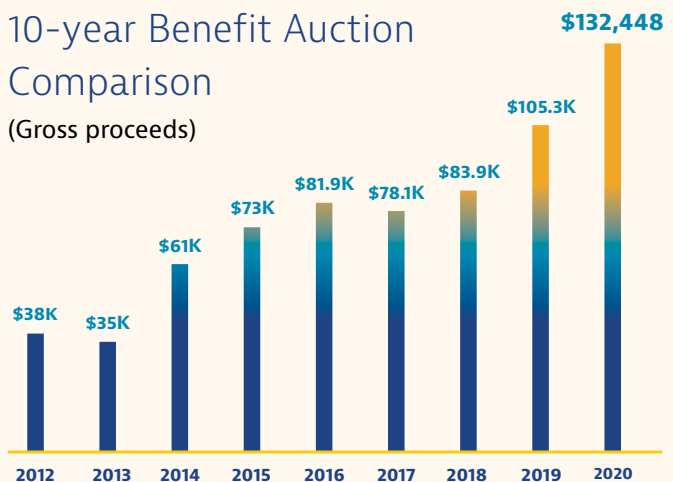

**■ STEPHEN OWSLEY**

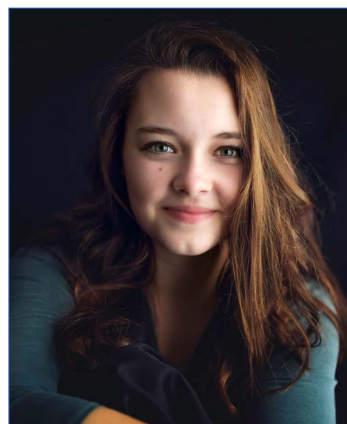

**■ JUDAH RAUCH**

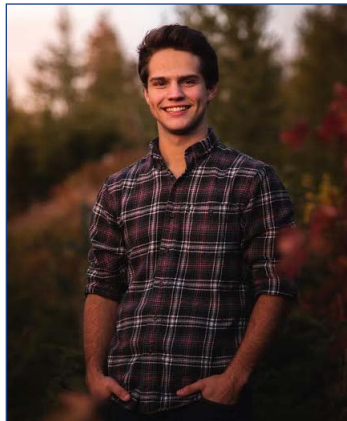

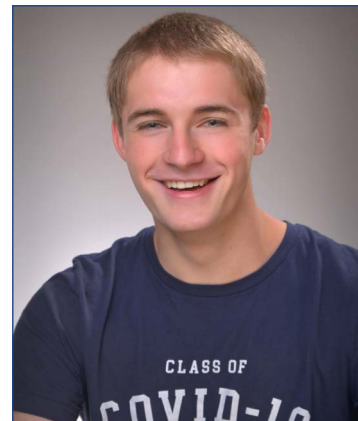
■ ELEANOR STORY
