A Third of a Century of Growth

Logos School was about to begin its seventh year. Principal Tom Garfield and the school board had hired a 5th grade teacher who was about to begin his first year of teaching. But the hiring depended on enrollment, and enrollment in turn seemed to depend on getting a new building on Baker Street.

By the grace of God—and even without George Müller praying for the needs—Logos got the new building and moved out of the Paradise Hills Church of God. It was late in the fall of 1987. I was that 5th grade teacher.

As I looked at sixteen 5th grade faces for the first time, they looked back at me: Ben, Kim, Brian, Jeralee; the triplets David, Dee Dee, and Dana; Joel, Sarada, Robyn, Preston, Todd, Jenny, Rachel, Emmy and Kevin. They had come to Logos School to be classically and Christian-ly educated. I stood there nervous, feeling awkward wearing a tie, and thinking, “I’m too young to be called ‘Mister.’” How was I going to teach these students, and to impart an education I had not received? But I worked and they worked, and we all learned, and next year I was still in 5th grade, knowing more than the year before.

Now fast forward a third of a century. I’ve had the blessing of seeing my own children go through Logos, three of whom I taught. I enjoy seeing my grandson Asher when I pass him in the halls. Former students are now sending their kids to Logos: this year eight of my eighteen students are second-generation students. Counting this year’s class, I’ve taught 655 fifth graders, so perhaps you can sympathize with me when I call a student by the name of a brother or sister or parent.

Logos School has always had a solid philosophical base to build on. The challenge has been to bring that vision to life

in the classroom: teaching well, gathering, creating and organizing an effective curriculum. The early years were often hard, starting largely from scratch, and working part-time jobs in the evenings or Saturdays to make ends meet.

A proverb says, "The journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step." We were headed in the right direction, and God has honored our steps, however small they may have seemed at times. We have made progress. Sometimes progress is easier to see in small things, like P.E., art and drama. That first year, I was the P.E. and art teacher for my class; now we have a real P.E. teacher and a real art teacher. And in the early years, the assembly plays were more like impromptu skits. I am writing this having just seen Mrs. Kramer's class's outstanding performance of the myth of Persephone. And I no longer feel awkward wearing a tie, nor am I too young to be called "Mister." ☕

2020 Football Recap

The lights went out on the 2020 Logos football season early—one half early, to be precise.

The Knights' final game was called at halftime because wet, heavy snow blanketed their football field and led to a power outage. They lost the game, 16-14, to Lewis County's varsity squad.

It was a strange end to a season marked by three canceled games because of COVID-19, wildfire smoke, and injuries on another team. Yet that last snowy night of the year did nothing to sully the second year of Logos football.

The program expanded this fall from one to two teams (adding a junior varsity team in addition to a junior high club) and from 18 players last year to 46 this year—23 players each on the JV and junior high rosters. It also jumped from four to nine coaches across both teams.

The growth in the young program was evident in more than just raw numbers, though.

The JV team went 3-1 and the junior high went 4-1. Those sparkling records came despite the fact most of the players—and a few of the coaches—were learning on the fly.

"The vast majority of the JV team had never played football before and learned a complex offense and scheme and were able to win football games, despite very little experience," head JV coach Nick Holloway said. Holloway was especially pleased with the chemistry from his coaching staff and his players. They came together to live out Logos School's motto of "Gratitude. Sacrifice. Excellence."

Gratitude, he said, was stressed "as the boys showed great thankfulness for all of the effort the school, community, and parents had put forth to put together a team."

Sacrifice came as players put their physical well-being on the line for the greater good of the team.

Excellence, meanwhile, came through "getting eight different players to all perform their jobs on each and every play," Holloway said. That is "a labor of achieving excellence."

Junior Lief Comis accounted for eight touchdowns and was named the team's offensive MVP. Junior Aiden Elmore took home defensive MVP honors. Freshman quarterback Jack Driskill threw 13 touchdowns.

Next fall the team will play a varsity schedule in Idaho's Class 1A Division 1 ranks.

2020 Cross Country Recap

Logos cross country runners learned early on that, yes, the 2020 season was going to be strange, but they could adapt to the COVID-19 precautions, wildfire smoke, wind, and everything else thrown their way just fine.

Through the adversity, the Knights learned something else about themselves too: They had talented runners, a whole host of them. And they loved to push each other and compete.

The Logos boys and girls produced sustained, teamwide excellence from start to finish in 2020.

They were strong against big-school competition at the smoky Timberlake Farragut Invitational, beat even more large schools at the Inland Empire Challenge, cruised to victory at the windy Logos Invite in Lewiston, and captured boys' and girls' district titles, also in Lewiston.

Logos capped a sterling year at the Class 1A state meet in Pocatello, where the boys punched second place and the girls took third.

"To have two teams with results in the top three," coach Paula Casebolt said, "is really a testament to how the girls' and the boys' teams work together as one team. That's my goal as a coach, and it's really awesome to see that turn up in the results. And it really comes down to the talent and determination of each individual runner."

Senior Alex Blum finished sixth at state, just 2 seconds behind the fifth-place finisher. Jase Elmore (11th place) and Theo Sentz (13th) also medaled.

Junior Clara Anderson took home eighth on the girls' side. Freshmen Sara Casebolt (12th) and Alyssa Blum (13th) medaled as well.

Coach Casebolt pointed out both teams at state finished just four points ahead of the team behind them. "Just a tiny surge from each runner or breaking into a group ahead" contributed to those efforts, she said.

The top three for the boys and girls at state were Logos' top performers all season.

For the girls, Anderson, Casebolt, and Blum came in 1-2-3 at districts, with Kayte Casebolt fifth. Emma Handel and Ava Driskill finished in the top 20.

For the boys, Elmore finished second at districts, but he was far from alone. Blum, Sentz, Jasper Whitling, Wyatt Haynes, and John Crawford all cracked the top 10.

Volleyball

Entering the volleyball season of 2020, no one was sure of what to expect. First off, the school was entering a new division, which would add challenges and tougher competition than the players had faced before. This, however, was not the only change God had planned for the school's athletics. Covid19 had changed the game. There were small changes made by the league, as well as more issues requiring rescheduling. The teams did not switch sides after a game, there was occasionally a requirement to stand rather than sit on the bench (unless a mask was worn), and the ball had to be cleaned if it went into the audience. Despite these strange times, the Logos volleyball team continued in an effort to demonstrate the school motto of gratitude, sacrifice, and excellence, coached by Jessica Evans and alumni Grace Belschner. Though they had a short season, the team improved in all areas, from varsity setter Lily Leidenfrost, who totaled 212 assists, to swingers getting on the court, including Signe Holloway for her passing accuracy and Lina Jankovic for her hard snap. Leading the team were four seniors. Kirsten Wambeke, the captain on the court, had the highest kill record finishing the season with 243. Olivia Igielski, a starting front row blocker and hitter, was an expert at the misleading tip. Playing the position of right-side hitter, Hero Merkle had a consistent serve giving us a strong start in many games. Lucia Wilson was the final senior on the team, and

made a scary opponent with her soaring vertical before the net contributing 39 blocks. There were also other strong players on the court this year. Ellie Brower, a sophomore, stepped up to the position of libero, playing full varsity and passing almost 200 digs. Lucia Spencer, a freshman, played as a defensive specialist for the team. Through the season, the whole team grew in skill and ability and finished with a record of 7-7 for Logos volleyball.

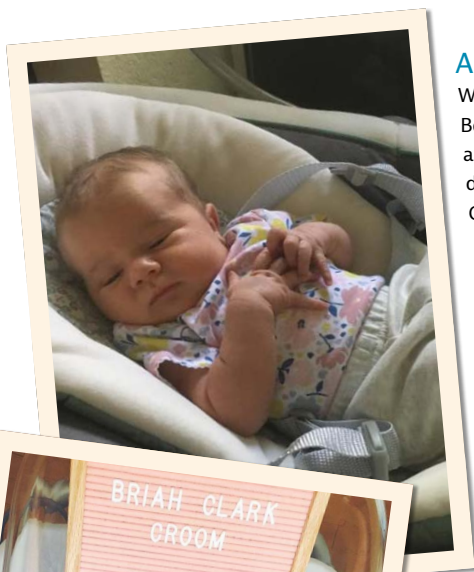

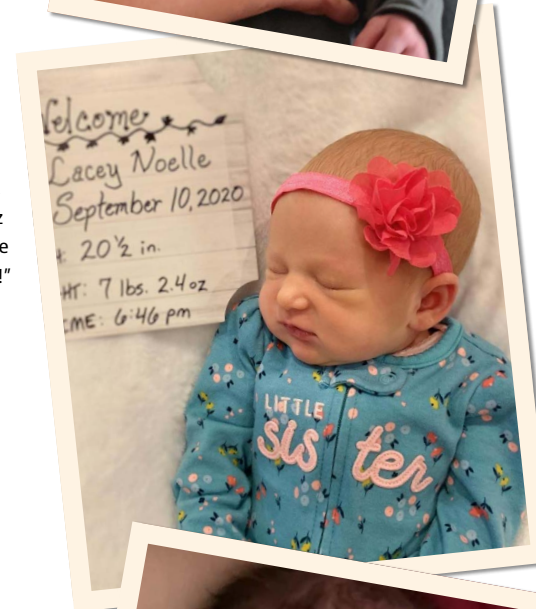
