# Music in the Classical Christian School

**A**t a classical Christian school, all subjects are ultimately doxological; all subjects should begin and end with grateful praise to God. None, however, is more plainly doxological than music.

Music is one of God's primary appointed means for His creatures made in His image to give voice to joyful praise—in fact, it is both hard-wired into us, and is also an imperative: we are *commanded* to sing praises to God. We are educating our children to become the next generation of worshippers shaped by the classical transcendental triad of truth, goodness, and beauty—who know God's truth, desire the good, and love the beautiful, who outstrip us in rightly understanding the world, loving what God loves, and giving Him praise for it. Therefore, we must grow them as singers; we must give them the tools of learning as they pertain to the realm of music.

Music is one of God's primary appointed means for His creatures made in His image to give voice to joyful praise—in fact, it is both hard-wired into us, and is also an imperative.

Music education thus becomes an imperative, and the form that education should take flows from this doxological fountainhead. The rich musical heritage of the Christian West is a language, so it must be taught as a language to our students, from our youngest poll-parrot class to our most advanced rhetoric level. They must be taught to sing and make music with understanding, because that is how they will have access to the riches of the past (much as we open to them the treasure trove of classical literature and thought); so a classical Christian school will make *musical* literacy foundational.

A Christ-centered music education will give them the vocabulary of the hymns and psalms of the church; a classical approach will train their loves and affections by teaching them masterworks that have stood the test of time and win them with beauty as they make music with artistic excellence. Most of all, the singing and music-making in this kind of school must be characterized primarily by joy—a visitor to our campus should be struck by the way our students are singing much as a hungry shopper is struck by the smell of fresh baked bread floating through the air of the bakery. ☪

midway through, Logos Mock Trial was still reeling when the team learned that all competitions would be virtual this year.

Despite having to learn a brand-new format and strategy, the students had an incredibly successful season.

All rounds were held via Zoom, and the local business Emsi generously offered use of their beautiful new facility (and top-notch internet) for the competitions. Without this, the season would not have been either as smooth or as successful.

New head coach and Mock-Trial-alum Mackenzie Miller headed up the program and led the A team with Laina Wyrick (another Mock Trial alum) and Dan Vis (a local attorney and Logos dad). Attorneys on the A team were seniors Ronen Wyrick, Kalkidan Meyer, and Ava Driskill, and juniors Kaylee Vis and Alice Miller. Witnesses were seniors Sid Sanford, Kalkidan Meyer, Josiah Rauch, and Mallory Struble, along with sophomore Lily Grauke. The team participated in four

preliminary rounds in February and March. They then went on to the state competition on March 18-20. The team played and won all four rounds on the 18th and 19th, entering the championship round as the only undefeated team. A close loss in the final round to Ambrose School in Meridian earned them second place in the state. Ronen Wyrick, Josiah Rauch, and Kalkidan Meyer received "top 10" attorney and witness awards. Josephine Wyrick was the team's courtroom artist, and placed third in state with her sketch of a live courtroom scene.

This year the B team was coached by Emma Whear, another Logos Mock Trial alum. She helped the young team navigate the complexities of the law and develop their skills, and they had a great time at their first round of regionals and state competition. The attorneys for the B team were sophomore Zach Atwood, and freshmen Annabelle Crapuchettes, Jubilee Joiner, Clive Miller, and Eve Rench. The witnesses were juniors John Crawford and Rilla Story, and freshmen Joe Story, Oscar Beauchamp, and Annabelle Crapuchettes. The team is thankful to the organizers for not cancelling the program and finding ways to move forward with competition, and they look forward to going back to in-person competitions next year! 🍀

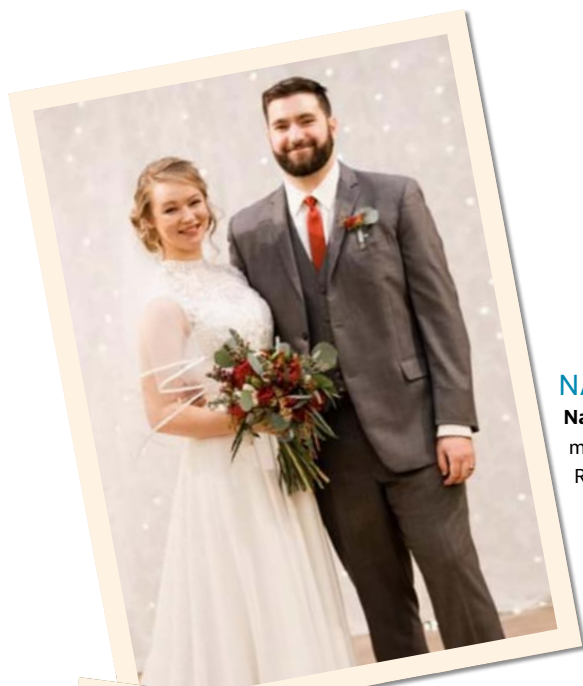

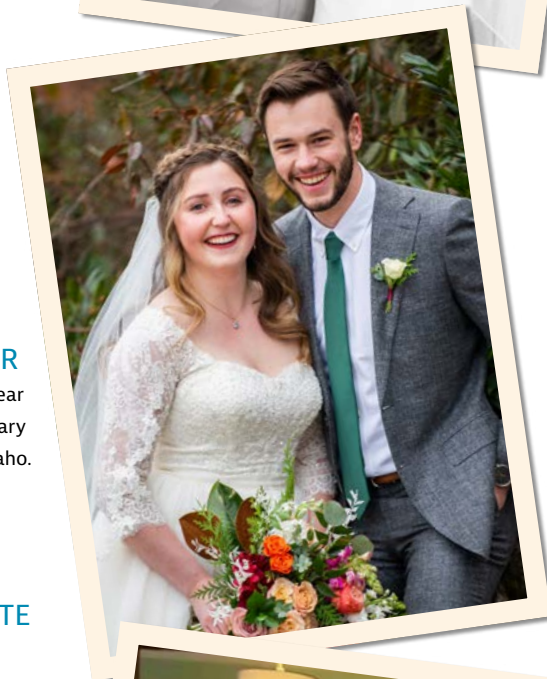

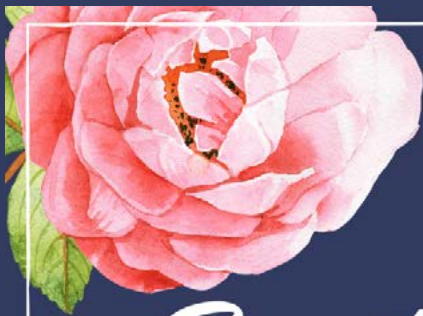
