# Essential Rhetoric

While it may surprise some, a quick google reveals that the most pervasive anxiety in the United States is a special little social disorder called glossophobia. Translation: *the fear of public speaking.*

According to the NSAC (National Social Anxiety Center) website, almost three quarters of our population finds speaking in public more frightening than other biggies like spiders, heights, and even death itself. And that was pre-covid. After more than a year of lockdowns, quarantines, and general social dysfunction, I think we can safely expect our collective case of the nerves to have increased when we finally all crawl back into the sunlight, blinking and anemic, and are once again forced to speak to each other in that thing we used to call public.

There are many benefits to a classical Christian education. Many. And that's an understatement. But, in my experience as an alumnus, the most important and most valuable upside came at the very end of my time at Logos, in the Rhetoric classes.

Without Rhetoric, everything else is pointless.

An engine might be incredibly powerful or finely tuned and capable of fantastic speeds, but without axles and wheels, tires and controls, what will that engine accomplish? A student who has received a Logos education through elementary school might have a huge amount of information stored in their noggin. Send that student through junior high, and all that retained information will become more useful as Formal Logic and the concepts of soundness and validity are taught and absorbed. But we're only just getting to the important part. As students rise through high school, they must put that engine in a car.

Simple communication skills can be taught, devoid of content and clear thinking, but that approach only leads to shallow manipulation. When students have been given a great deal of content, and they have been given the ability to integrate and distill content into coherent and valid argumentation, and then they are trained in classical rhetoric, the fruit is an ability to write and speak truth in clear, compelling, and selfless ways to any crowd, in any context, on any subject. This is so much more than toastmaster exercises or an ability to be funny at parties. It is the disciplined ability to discover the available means of persuasion in any situation whatsoever, to structure a speech or paper in an organically compelling way, and to do so in a way that humbly serves readers or listeners rather than simply impresses them.

In my now fourteen year career as a novelist and producer, I have been knee deep in many bizarre and unexpected conversations and situations. I have been given opportunities to carefully plan and script my communications, and I've been thrown into impromptu situations with TV shows and livelihoods on the line. Thanks to all the hard work of my teachers at Logos, all of my glossophobic nerve endings were completely deadened in front of my classmates and teachers back in the mid-90s. To this day, the instruction I received in Rhetoric classrooms saves more of my bacon than any other.

As I watch my own children begin to emerge from Logos, joining me as my fellow alumni, I am even more grateful to see them benefit from the same instruction. They have been given so much, but without Rhetoric, it would all be pointless. ⊕

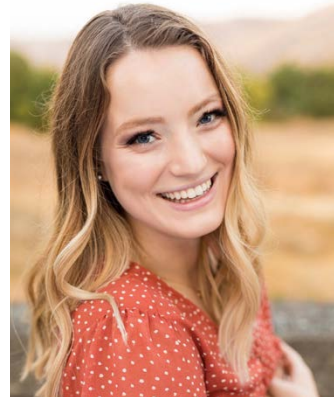
### ■ RENATA SWAIT

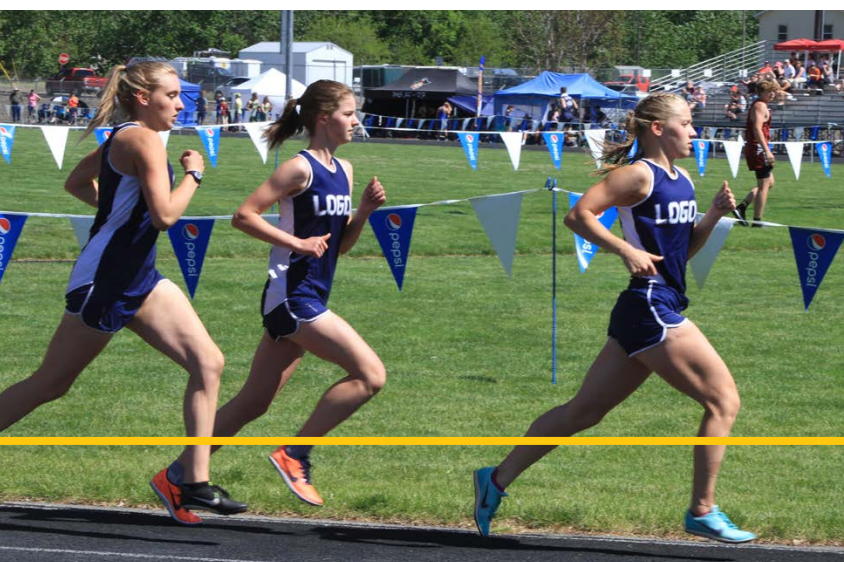
# SPRING Athletics Roundup

## Track

The Logos track and field team and coaches were so thankful they were able to have a season! They competed in eight regular season track meets: the district meet where the girls won the meet and the boys placed 2nd by 1.25 points, and at the state meet in Middleton on May 21 and 22. They ran in rain, snow, wind, sun, 90-degree weather and 40-degree weather in the same week. They ran on dirt, grass, gravel, new runways, roads, and on tracks. For the first time in the history of Logos track and field, the team had a place of their own for practice. The new property has a pole vault pit, hurdles, blocks, runways, 600 meters of gravel road, and a portable throwing ring. The team also dug dirt for a pit to be able to practice long and triple jump. It is now filled with sand. For all of that we are incredibly thankful! Three Logos School records were broken this season. The team of Aiden Elmore, Liev Comis, Cody Stevens, and Solomon Howard beat the boys 4x200m record that has been on the books since 2000 with a time of 1:39.9. The 4x400 relay team of Lucy Wilson, Lina Jankovic, Alyssa Blum, and Clara Anderson (with a time of 4:14.41) beat the previous record that had been set in 2003. Sara Casebolt's time of 11:45.98 in the 3200 beat Heather (Wilson '12) Fluhart's record from 2012.

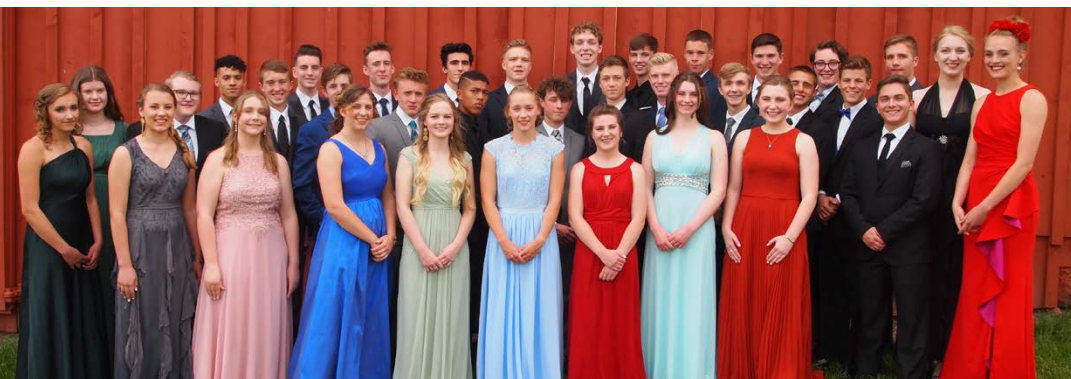


# Protocol

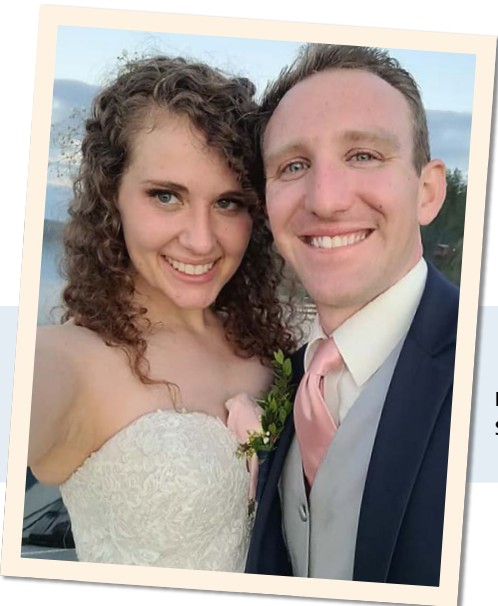

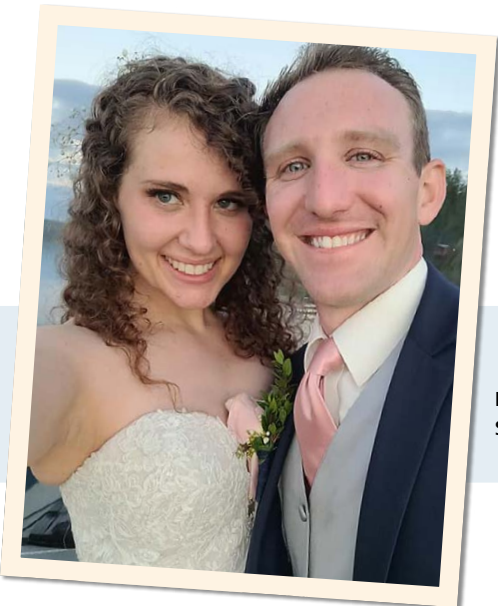
