Something Old, Something New

The three Logos secondary choirs— Junior High, High School, and the honors level Chamber Choir— were pleased to present their second annual Spring Concert on May 10 at the Church of the Nazarene.

The concert, conducted by Aaron Snell and accompanied by Corinne Reagan, was titled “Something Old, Something New...” and featured each choir singing one piece by a composer from history, one by a living composer, and one African-American spiritual. The performances represented a high-water mark for the students’ musical achievement for the year.

After all students sang an opening processional hymn that looked back to saints of old to give courage for our present time, the Junior High Choir told the story of God’s coming




judgment with Mozart’s “Dies Irae,” our refuge in our high priest Jesus with Snell’s “We Have This Hope.” They finished by singing about our joy in salvation with the spiritual “Ain’t That Good News.” The superior-rated Chamber Choir began with a renaissance setting of Psalm 33 (Hakenberger’s “Exultate Justi”), followed by a beautifully set piece of French poetry (Lauridsen’s “Contre Qui, Rose”), the spiritual “My Soul’s Been Anchored in the Lord,” and as a bonus, the Irish folk song “Danny Boy.”


The High School Choir tackled some particularly difficult music, beginning with the double choir 8-part German piece “Ehre sei Gott in der Höhe” (Glory to God in the Highest) by Mendelssohn. They were joined by Dr. Mark Reagan on French horn for the contemporary “In Remembrance,” and finished with the technically challenging but incredibly fun spiritual “Wade In de Water.”

The evening was cap-stoned by what we hope will be a new tradition – the seniors stepping out to the front and the choir being joined on stage by Logos alumni to sing our school song, “Non Nobis.” What a great way to end a fantastic year of growth in singing to the Lord! ☪

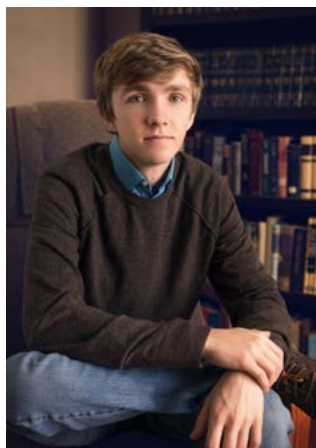

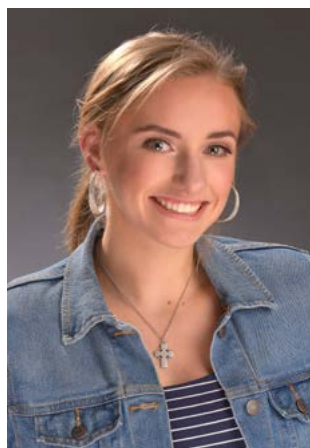
Jasper WHITLING

This season marked the last year for head coach Ben Merkle, the team gained two new coaches (Dane Kowalick and Ian McManus), and the boys advanced to the State Playoffs for the first time in over ten years. After a couple rough seasons filled with Covid complications, the team really enjoyed seeing their efforts come to fruition.

Out of the eighteen players on the team, eight of them were seniors, Alex Ahman, Jackson Crapuchettes, John Crawford, Will Griffith, Wyatt Haynes, Kenny Kline, Judah Merkle, and River Sumpter. Although the team will be losing a lot of starters, the future of the program is very promising with eight freshmen giving valuable contributions to this year's success. The team's in-league record was 3-2, which included an upset victory over Coeur d'Alene, finishing with a two goal comeback in the last minute. The boys were also able to compete during three trips to southern Idaho, including one for the State Playoffs.

Coach Merkle has been coaching the team for over twenty years, and has been a driving force in the growth of the lacrosse program at Logos. He has coached dozens of Logos boys in his time, including his own sons. The boys are incredibly grateful for the time and effort that he has put into the team, and are sad to see him go. He has brought his experience as a coach, a father, a teacher, and a pastor to his time with the Knights, and has used that to help the young men at Logos School.

Our golf team was able to complete its first full season of competition. Coach Stan Miller helped the five boys and two girls compete in multiple matches and improve throughout the year.
