GOD-HONORING EXCELLENCE

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God-Honoring Excellence

Since its inception over forty years ago, Logos has striven to deliver a classical, Christ-centered education to equip students to shape culture through wise and victorious Christian living.

We envision graduates that have been saturated in a God-honoring culture built upon a biblical foundation. In turn, our graduates will rebuild Christendom, becoming leaven which spreads through every area of life- one household, one family at a time. Anthony Esolen explains this well in describing Charles Wesley, who wrote over 6,500 hymns of high quality. "To get a Wesley, you need people so steeped in Scripture that the language and the images, the stories, the lessons, and the prophecies, come to their minds readily, even unbidden." We fully expect the fruits of a Logos

education to fly from the fingertips of our graduates wherever God may lead them as Esolen says, even unbidden. As Isaiah prophesied of Judah's remnant that they "may take root downward, and bear fruit upward."

Over time, Logos has adopted a motto which guides and helps pursue this vision of culture making: gratitude, sacrifice, excellence.

We begin with gratitude because from this all else flows. "In everything give thanks," Paul admonishes us, "for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you" (1 Thessalonians 5:18). A grateful heart has been the standard posture for Logos from day one. We certainly did not despise that small day when we welcomed 18 students to the school. The same heart attitude was present in welcoming over 600 students this past August. God has greatly blessed our school community. We are thankful for all of our families, faculty, and staff. An established orientation of gratitude serves as a ballast keeping us steady in times of plenty and in times of want.

In sacrifice, we closely resemble our Lord who admonishes us to deny ourselves, take up our crosses, and to follow him (Matthew 16:24). Sacrifice is a hallmark at Logos. Our faculty and staff sacrifice countless hours and time pouring into our students insisting that they reach their fullest potential in God honoring ways. Our families sacrifice to be obedient to God's command to raise their children in the nurture and admonition of the Lord. Our students build a strong work ethic as they pursue the rigors of academic requirements. Whether it is mock trial, drama, or choir performances, our students sacrifice free time for the sake of something greater. Likewise, in athletics our young men and women truly pour out blood, sweat, and tears to pursue goals as a team. In all of these, there is a pattern of dying unto self and sacrificing the immediate for greater long-term goals. Great effort and hard work are done for and unto the glory of God.

As Paul is closing his letter to the Philippians, he reminds them which

things to think upon. “Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things” (Philippians 4:8 ESV). Throughout a student’s time at Logos, those things which are excellent are given to our students for them to consider deeply. Whether a great work of literature, poetry, music, or painting, students learn what is really true, good, and beautiful. This is not limited to what we normally consider the arts. Great mathematical proofs, scientific discoveries, and even principles of good government reveal their excellence and reflection of God’s holy character.

All of this is formative for our students. A great standard is presented from the earliest years through graduation. Excellence does not merely remain an external quality. The goal is for our graduates to internalize and love the standard in order to live lives of excellence and virtue. Our goal is to follow in the footsteps of the sons of Issachar (I Chronicles 12:32). We want graduates that understand the times and are able to identify what ought to be done. Our aim is for students to ask simply from a heart of love for Christ what obedience and wisdom require?

Have we been successful? By many measures, we can confidently say yes. The greatest indication of success has been our first generation graduates desiring this same education for their



children. 149 of our 610 students are second generation enrollees.

This is leaven working through the loaf. This is the kingdom growing one student, one household at a time, shaping culture through wise and victorious Christian living.


The mission at Logos remains steadfast and will not change. It is done non nobis. Not unto us, but unto God be the glory. ⊕

Cross Country

HIGH SCHOOL CROSS COUNTRY

The Logos boys' and girls' high school cross-country teams have consistently performed and competed well in past years, and the 2022 season was another successful one. Cross-country season officially began in August, but most of the runners tallied summer mileage, which set them up for speed in the early weeks of training and competitions. The team was composed of ten girls and nine boys, who were willing and ready



to sacrifice for each other at every practice and meet. Logos cross-country proved throughout this season that they were fast enough to compete against the biggest and strongest schools in the area. Alum Paula Casebolt ('94), in her sixth year as coach, took both of her teams to state for the fourth successive year. Both girls' and boys' teams took first place at districts, punching their ticket to the state meet which took place in Lewiston this year, an ideal location and course for Logos fans and spectators. The Logos runners had previously run this course three times in the 2022 season, giving them an advantage over the southern Idaho schools. The girls' team took home the second-place trophy at state, led by top finishers junior Sara Casebolt and sophomore Mari Calene, crossing the finish line in second and third. The girls also took home the 1A academic state champion title for the season. The boys' team placed sixth at the state meet, led by senior Zach Atwood with a tenth-place finish, followed by Simeon

Rauch in twenty-fourth place. Coach Paula Casebolt said of the team's accomplishments at state, "In the state meet, I saw you all sacrifice; I saw you improve. I saw excellence. All the work you did over the last several months paid off and you got to run fast at a state meet to God's glory and for the sake of your teammates."

JUNIOR HIGH CROSS COUNTRY

This year's junior high cross-country team consisted of 15 runners, coached by Logos 2021 alum, Kayte Casebolt. The team participated in seven total meets this season and both teams placed fifth in the Bi-State Championship, the final meet of the season. The junior high team is continuing to build our cross-country program with their talent and improvement this season.

HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL

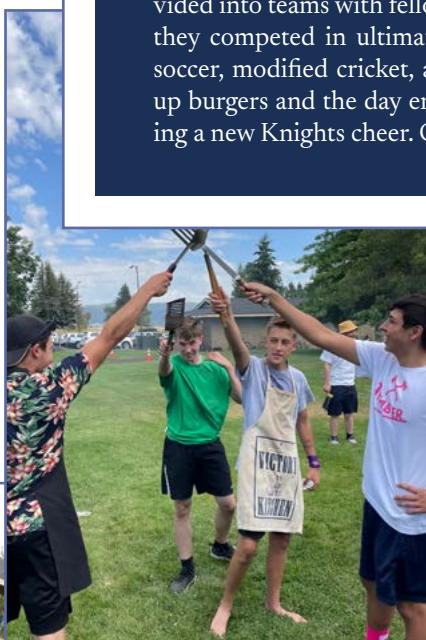
