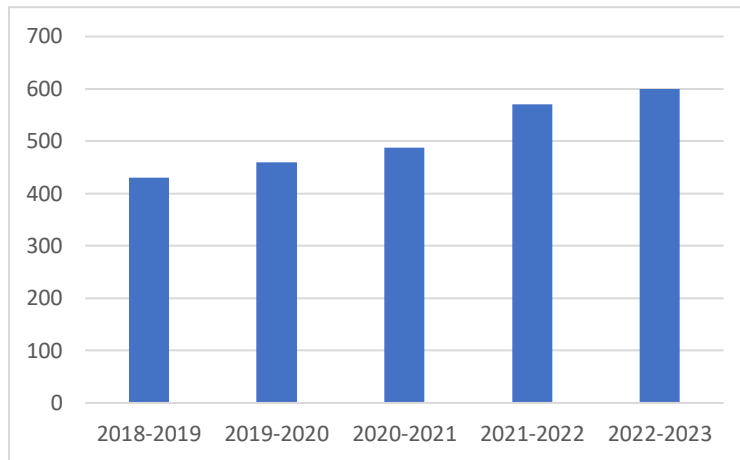


Figure 1: Year Over Year Enrollment Growth

## ACADEMICS AND EXTRACURRICULARS

We graduated a class of 23 students with high marks in both ACT and SAT scoring (70<sup>th</sup> and 73<sup>rd</sup> percentile respectively).

Our boys and girls cross-country teams won district titles and advanced to the state championship. The girls team claimed second place there. The girls and boys track teams won Whitepine league titles, and the girls earned a Regional Championship. The girls 4x400 team won a state championship and set a new state record. The Mock Trial team advanced to the state championship round and finished as the state runner-up. Our Chamber Choir

excelled, receiving the highest marks possible at the district festival and at each event they performed. The varsity production of the Sound of Music was a huge success, with a packed house for each performance.

We are operating on three campuses this year, and we continue to look for resourceful ways to use the space efficiently.

The school financials are strong, as we operate debt free and recognize growing enrollment. Through generous donors, we received over \$500K in donations this year. We used these donations for the infrastructure on the property and to offer tuition assistance to families.
