# Vanity of Vanities, Unless...

“**VANITY OF VANITIES,**” says the Preacher; ‘Vanity of vanities, all is vanity’” (Ecclesl. 1:2, NKJV). This isn’t the kind of vanity where you look at yourself too much in the mirror. It’s vanity that is worthless or futile. Solomon is saying that everything is worthless, unless....

Today we’re here to celebrate the end of high school. We’re here to celebrate the end of high school drama productions, of choir performances, of thesis writing. We’re here to celebrate twenty-three of us graduating. We’re here to recognize something we’ve been working towards for the last fourteen years, ever since preschool. I think we can all agree that we’ve come a long way since then.

Gone are the days when Mrs. Rust would teach us to color inside the lines. We’ve moved on to understanding how to draw and create something beautiful of our own. Gone are the days of memorizing the book of James with Mr. Becker. Mr. Brower taught us to understand why we memorize Scripture and how to apply it in our lives. Gone are the days of learning solfege with Mr. Erber. From Mr. Snell, we learned how to put that to use and sing glorious songs of praise. Over the last fourteen years, we have grown and fought and worked, and you know what? It’s all vanity, every bit of it, unless...

As we look back on our time in high school, we can see everything that we’ve done: all of our achievements, jokes,

speeches, sports, tests, teachers, moments, and memories that we’ve made throughout high school. Oftentimes it seems like a lot. It’s been most of our lives. Many of us spend more time in school and sports than anything else. Many of us spend more hours a day in school with each other than we spend hours sleeping, as much as we’d like school hours to be sleeping hours too. So many hours for so many days for so many years, and for what? Solomon says that all is vanity. Our work, our time in high school, our classical Christian education. All of it is vanity. It’s a wind. It’s a breath. It’s here today and gone tomorrow, unless...

Unless what? Why have we been in school these last fourteen years? Why did our parents pay to send us here? Why have we spent countless hours reading books like *Moby Dick*, studying for long, long Church History finals, and debating over whether or not Christmas music can be sung in the spring? Why did Mr. Struble teach us chemistry and the periodic table of elements? Why did we go out onto the University of Idaho campus to evangelize? Why did we memorize all those



Bible passages? Why did we do all this work? Why, if our work is vanity?

It's because it wasn't about the work. It wasn't about the classes we took or the grades we got. It wasn't about the books we read or the discussions we had. It wasn't even about what we learned. It was about people – the people in our class, the people in our school, and every person we'll meet for the rest of our lives. It was about our lives, here, now, and forever. C. S. Lewis once said, "There are no ordinary people. You have never talked to a mere mortal [...] it is immortals whom we joke with, work with, marry, snub, and exploit - immortal horrors or everlasting splendors" (Lewis, "The Weight of Glory"). Everything we do in life, every thought, word, and deed, prepares the people around us for good or evil, heaven or

hell, eternity with God or eternity without him.

Even the littlest things, like what we said at dinner last night or how we drove to this graduation today, point to one end or the other. If we point to God and His love, then our work has mean-

ing. If not, it is vanity. All is vanity, unless...unless it points to Christ and His saving work, because His work is the only thing that has true meaning. So where is our work, our teachers' work,


our education pointing? Is our education bringing us closer to God and His love? If we're not pointing to Him, if we don't have His love, we are nothing. Paul tells us that. You can have everything. You can have the world, not just a great education or great parents. But it's pointless if it doesn't have love. Every area of our lives is meaningless unless we learn to take it captive to God's love.

That's why we ran the mile every week in junior high. That's why we figured out what the inside of a worm looked like in biology. That's why we stayed up unreasonably late writing 6,000-word theses. That's why we argued and prayed and sang and laughed together. That's why we learned...so that we can learn to love.

And we can't take any of the credit for it either. If it weren't for our parents
