School District Explainer

A strategic plan for school growth that maintains our commitment to a truly personal—and truly Christian—education for our students

FOR A NUMBER OF YEARS.

the long-term vision for the growth of Logos School, as it was held by the Logos School board, was to limit our growth to two classes per grade level, K-12. This would put an upper limit of our total enrollment at somewhere between 500 and 600 students (depending on the sizes of individual classes). It was the conviction of the board (and remains our conviction) that for our school to grow any larger than this would result in the depersonalization of the education we offer, which is another way of contradicting the kind of educa-

tion we seek to offer. This conviction also set the architectural limits and constraints for our building project on the northeast side of Moscow.

As the result of a decision made by the board a few years ago (May 27, 2020), we have altered our strategic plan for our growth, but in a way that maintains our commitment to the truly personal and truly Christian education of our students. This decision was brought about as we considered the ramifications of a significant migration of many Christian families to Moscow, with many more anticipated, coupled with the current size of our waiting pool. And while we were grateful

for all the Christian education options available in Moscow, we also felt that if we closed off our ability to grow in this season of growth, we would be encouraging a situation that could lead to unhealthy competition.

The decision was to form the Logos School District. To give you a better picture of what we have in mind, we would like you to imagine how the school district would look ten years from now. What is our vision for this, in other words? Our new facilities off Mountain View would be the secondary school (7–12), able to accommodate between

500 and 600 students. Our current facility on Baker Street would be one of our elementary schools. We would also be operating two other elementary schools from other locations in Moscow. These schools would be the feeder schools for the secondary school, and the enrollment of these schools would be maintained in such a way as to ensure that the secondary school would always be able to accept all students coming from those schools.

What this does is enable us to handle larger numbers of students but without losing the human scale that we believe is necessary to effective education.


Chantelle has been involved in classical Christian education since having children. She volunteered as a PE teacher at Covenant one year, and currently serves as a board member for the school.




