The End of a Matter

2024 Valedictory Address

THE PREACHER OF ECCLESIASTES

said, “The end of a matter is better than its beginning.” To be here, on this stage, feels absolutely amazing. For the majority of us, it has been a long fourteen years of hard work. From preschool to high school we have been put through the grind that is classical education. We have spent so much of our short lives laboring to finally put us in this position today.

But we didn’t do all the work. We can’t go on without giving thanks to our parents, who paid our tuition year after year, even when we got pink slips. Parents who worked so hard to make sure we woke up on time, did our homework on time, had lunches to eat, played the sports we wanted, and that we grew up in this blessed community. They care more about us than we can ever know.

Thanks to our teachers, who spent so much time putting up with our foolery. They gave their skills to give us a fantastic education when they could have been out there making a lot more money. But they chose us over themselves, and we don’t give them nearly enough thanks. They are the ones who deserve parties at the end of the year.

Finally, thanks to God, who has truly blessed us. He put each of us in this place, giving us friends and joy, trials and tribulations, homework and parties. Only through what is obviously His divine power are we all here alive and well today after all the things we got into. He put us in a time of change, including football, Mr. Wiggins, our very own field, and new classmates.

He allowed us to be here and learn this classical, Christian education of ours. It is this education that will set us apart from others in the future. It sets us apart because classical education is not just the Christian version of public education. It is something much more. As some of you may know, classical education is how education used to be practiced from the time of the Greeks all the way to the early 1900s. Its system is built around the three stages of learning: grammar, logic, and rhetoric. These steps are designed in a specific order to follow the natural development of a student. When we were younger, we memorized more, as this is what younger brains are suited for. As we get older, we start to move on to logic, beginning to make connections in all the mix of information we learn. And we cap it all off in high school when we learn to apply all these tools in public speaking with rhetoric. Of course, mixed in with these themes are math, science, and history.

But the thing that makes this classical *Christian* education is that all these classes are taught with God in mind. One of the forefront issues in our culture is the continuing separation of Christian ideas and worship from everyday life. James 1:22 says, “But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves.” If we go to

church on Sunday, yet do not act like the Christians we say we are at home, at work, and at *school*, then are we faithfully fulfilling our duties?

But with the classical Christian method, at Logos, we do not separate truth from any learning, so that we might fulfill its mission: “to graduate young men and women who are equipped to shape culture through wise and victorious Christian living.”

Need a break from the ads?

“...To graduate young men and women.” It’s been a long time coming. Graduation for us seniors is the finish line of a race that has been the center of our focus for almost all our lives. We have each spent nearly fifteen thousand hours in school and hundreds more in sports, some of us in the same Logos building since we started.

This race, this finish line that is just a few minutes away, is the pinnacle of one of the greatest chapters of our lives. From here we will go on to college to study medicine, engineering, liberal arts, and so on. Some of us will move into jobs. Others will go to trade school. We will make new friends and lose old ones.

Tragically, we shall begin to pay enormous amounts of taxes. Soon, many of us will get married and begin to raise families of our own.

But none of us will ever forget or regret the time we spent here. Though this graduation is indeed the end of an era, it is not the end in every sense of the word. Graduation is not the final goal

of education, any more than the curtain call is the final goal of a play. All the important things happened in the middle.

We have received many valuable lessons from our teachers, from working hard to adapting to unexpected situations. We teased each other, learning to both criticize and take criticism. And joyfully working hard through troubled times is one of the most important lessons of all.

As a class, we all have grown tremendously throughout our time here. What began as small has turned into something much more considerable.

Because the truth is, we are all conservative Christians. This means that we are some of the most hated, most ridiculed people on this planet. Everywhere we go out of this community of ours we will be faced with a choice. Either we can hide our face, hide our beliefs, and let our Christian upbringing and education go to waste. Or we will follow the lessons we have learned and do what we know to be right and spread happiness and the truth through all the

hate and ridicule that comes our way.

If you take a moment to remember back to the start of this speech, I mentioned the verse, “The end of a matter is better than its beginning.” As a class, we all have grown tremendously throughout our time here. What began as small has turned into something much more considerable.

We began by memorizing our ABC’s and ended up knowing more poems than we could care to count.

We began by writing little stories with mandatory dress-ups and ended by presenting our 6000-word thesis.

We began as toddlers playing tag in PE, getting beat by Mr. Crapuchettes running backward, and ended with the boys winning the league title and securing 3rd place in state football and the girls winning the track state championship.


In *Beowulf*, there is a line that reads, “when his days are all done, the worthiest warrior is well remembered.”


Moving forward, we will take all the skills we have learned and the memories we have gained, and make sure that when our days are done, we will be remembered as warriors for the Gospel.

Each and every person here has been part of our class’s journey, and I promise that the work that you have put in, the time you have sacrificed, and the love you have given to me and my classmates will not go to waste.

We have fought the good fight. We go now to finish the race. ⊕

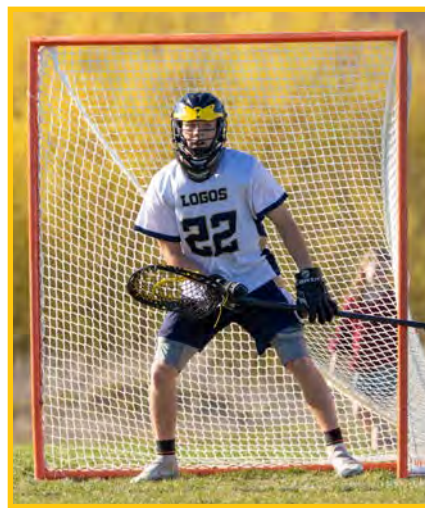


Lacrosse

HIGH SCHOOL

The Knights' high school lacrosse team had a great season with some exciting wins! Head coach Ian McManus, assisted by Dane Kowalick and alum Bennett Schlect ('19), coached a squad of seventeen guys. Three athletes were recognized by the Idaho High School Lacrosse League (IHSL): senior Clive Miller (2nd Team All-Conference Face-off Specialist), junior George Evans (2nd Team Defense), and sophomore Miles Miller (2nd Team Attack). Coach

McManus said, "This season, we saw notable improvement in every major category—both as a team and individual contributors. We had more wins, goals scored, saves, and players recognized at the all-conference level. I am very proud of these young men and their work in building this program." Three 8th graders had the chance to play up, and, with the loss of just two seniors, the lacrosse program is poised for a big year next spring!

Track

HIGH SCHOOL

The Logos high school track team finished an incredibly successful season with a Girls State Championship, Boys and Girls Regional Championships, and Boys and Girls Whitepine League Championships! With 55 athletes, this year's team was well-rounded and highly competitive. In her 33rd year, head coach Gwen Spencer was assisted by Tyler Anderson (distance), Wayne

Browning (pole vault), John Carnahan (high jump), Bridgid Monjure ('23, hurdles), Justin Spencer ('06, long and triple jump), Nate Wilson ('96, 400m), and Caleb Wright (throws).

The state championship team was led by Sara Casebolt, who won all four of her events at state and broke six school records throughout the season in the 400m, 800m, 1600m, 3200m, sprint medley, and 4x400. She was joined in the 4x400 by Naomi Taylor, Alyssa Blum, and Chloe Jankovic. Naomi also set a school record in the 200m and was on the record-breaking 4x200 with



Emily Bowen, Bethany Porras, and Elizabeth Evans. Emily, Bethany, and Elizabeth were on the record-breaking sprint medley squad. Alyssa, Mari Calene, Eve Rench, and Lizzie Crawford set a record in the 4x800. KatieBeth Monjure broke the longest-standing Logos record (from

2012) in the long jump at state. And Evie Grauke set a record in the javelin, an event new to Idaho this year.

On the boys' team, the 4x200m relay record was broken at least six times this year, with the final squad of Henry Sundlie, Paul Grieser, Ben Carlson, and Ole

Sundlie setting the record of 1:34.49 at the state meet. The 4x800 team of Lucius Comis, Ransom Sentz, John Henry Crapuchettes, and Seamus Wilson set a new record, and Thomas Bowen set the javelin record with 138' 1", ranking 2nd in 1A in the state of Idaho.





JUNIOR HIGH

The Logos junior high track team had 63 athletes this year! Led by coaches Rob Sentz, Theo Sentz ('22), Isaac Grauke ('01), Faith Smeets, Nicole Covington, Shawna Applegate, and Nick Studt, the team competed in seven meets and set twelve new Logos JH records! The boys' team was led by Jerome

Sentz, with school records in the 100, 200, 400, and long jump, and Justice Mallery and his squads set records in the 4x100, 4x200, and 4x400. The girls' team was led by strong middle and long-distance runners. The girls' field athletes rounded them out with records set in the discus (Ruthanne Studt) and

high jump (Betty Atwood), and Lucy Points broke a 13-year record in the long jump. Coach Sentz says, "There was a lot of interest in track this year, and the school has been blessed with many talented, eager, and dedicated athletes and families. It sets us up well for the future!"
