New Secondary Campus

LOGOS NORTH

PAST

In 2016, through the provision of our good Lord and the generosity of our families, Logos School was able to purchase 30 acres next to Mountain View Park. Over the next five years we added a bridge over Paradise Creek, a football/lacrosse field, stadium lights, bleachers, ponds, and a very simple gravel drive to access the property.

In 2021, after adding over 140 new students to the school in the fall, an exuberant board member looked me in the eye, and said, “Whitling, you need

to build this new school!” After dusting off the original architectural drawings, hiring consultants to conduct a feasibility study, and then completely revamping the campus design to be modeled after the University of Virginia (thank you Mark Wintz and Harby & Points), we kicked off the silent phase of our current capital campaign in 2023, titled Non Nobis.

The 2024 auction featured a Fund-the-Need item called, “Staple Drive”. This included curbs, sidewalks, extensive excavation, and paving what is now our very own Logos Street. All of this

work was funded in one night by people who love Logos School, many of whom have been giving sacrificially for decades. This work is now complete, including 10 Flashfire Maple trees planted by Logos families.

PRESENT

In November, our board members held a groundbreaking ceremony in which we sang, thanked the Lord for his provision, heard stories from Doug Wilson about remodeling a roller skating rink into our current main campus, Logos West, and dug a ceremonial shovel-full of dirt on the south end of the property. The first academic building, Lewis, was a square of compacted gravel surrounded by pools of water and mud with an excavator parked next to it. At the beginning of December, the footings and foundation walls were poured,

then the subfloor was built, the sewer and power infrastructure was completed, and framing has begun!


FUTURE

Our goal is to have the Lewis Building complete by the fall of 2025 and to move our 10th-12th grade students (rhetoric stage) and our secondary principal, Mr. Wally Wiggins, out to Logos North for our inaugural year of instruction on the new campus! Lewis has been designed so that it can stand alone with a reception desk, staff room, principal's office and bathrooms, but ultimately it will be 1 of 7 buildings that will house the entire secondary school (7th-12th grades). The full campus is designed to double the capacity of our current secondary and our goal is to double the impact that Logos alumni have on our culture as well.

Christmas in the ARENA

Instead of the typical sounds of basketballs and squeaky court shoes, the ICCU Arena at the University of Idaho was filled with the glorious sounds of voices and instruments raised to celebrate the birth of Christ.


The Logos School choirs were thankful to be able to accommodate their growing audience in a spacious new venue—but old traditions held strong. Conducted by Aaron Snell and Shelli Fisher, and accompanied by Corinne Reagan and Heather Trauger, the concert began as always with a darkened stage (picturing the world darkened by

sin) and the high school students entering with lit candles (picturing Christ as the light of the world).

While senior Bryce McMurray read from John 1 and Matthew 1, the Chamber Choir processed in while singing *Of the Father's Love Begotten*, followed by the 10th-12th grade Rhetoric Choir (joined by an orchestra) singing the newer composition *O Savior of Our Fallen Race* and Renaissance composer Giovanni Gabrieli's *Hodie Christus natus est*.

The night unfolded with a telling of the Christmas story through Scripture reading and song. The combined Kindergarten and 1st grade sang about the birth of Christ in Bethlehem with the Italian carol *Dormi, Dormi* and a song with hand chimes named *Joy Has Filled the Sky*. The 8th-9th grade Dialectic Choir sang about the appearance of the angels to the shepherds with *The Shepherd's Echo Carol* and *While Shepherds Watched*. The 2nd and 3rd graders sang about His humble manger with *Shepherd, Kneel Softly* and the crowd-pleasing *Go Tell It On the Mountain*, featuring



soloists Violet Schultz and Abram Snell. The 4th-6th graders sang about the visit of the Magi with *Bell Carol of the Kings* (a combination of *We Three Kings* and *Carol of the Bells*), as well as the Welsh *Poverty Carol*, featuring soloist Leah Snell. The Chamber Choir performed two selections – the Sicilian *Carol of the Bagpipers* and the entertaining mash-up *Mozart's Fa-la-la*. The Rhetoric Choir took the stage again to close out the concert with *Lo, How a Rose* and the rousing movement from Handel's *Messiah*, *And the Glory of the Lord*. 



The Mousetrap

In October, Logos presented a foray into the murder mystery genre with the varsity production of *The Mousetrap* by Agatha Christie.

The Mousetrap, which initially premiered in London in 1952, is the world's longest-running play, thanks to its unique characters and its blend of witty comedy and tightly-wound suspense. Kate Pemberton, who directed the production, was very familiar with the story, having played Miss Casewell in her high school production at The Oaks, as well as directing it at a high school in Sioux Center, Iowa. Pemberton is currently working on her MFA in theatre at the University of Idaho.

"I chose this play because I wanted something that would really challenge our students in terms of acting," says Pemberton. "We recently produced two large-scale musicals, where a lot of time has to be spent on singing and choreography. I wanted to try something more intimate, where the students could really spend time delving into the intricacies of their characters." And they did.

Simeon Rauch and Mana Shafer played Giles and Mollie Ralston, the young couple who are just starting to run their guesthouse, Monkswell Manor, which becomes the site of a grisly murder. For Mana, this was her first lead in a production, yet she quickly

leaned into the character of Mollie with grace, in a lovely, grounded performance. Simeon played Giles with wonderful nuance, hitting all the emotional beats of his character's arc with strong believability. And Thomas Bowen, who recently played both the Beast and Captain Von Trapp, settled well into the more serious role of the inquisitive young detective.

There was also a colorful host of supporting characters, from the wildly eccentric yet sympathetic Christopher Wren (played with delightful energy by another newcomer to the stage, Max Hawthorne), the stern and icy Mrs. Boyle (Grace Mortimore), the kindly Major Metcalf (David Henreckson), the mysterious Miss Casewell (Ava Ginn), and the strange Italian Paravicini (Ryle Grauke). Each actor brought his or her character vividly to life in memorable performances.

The show also had two talented understudies (Ben Casebolt and Sophia Rauch), who performed as Metcalf and Boyle in the Thursday evening show. Pemberton expressed her deep gratitude for the tremendous hard work her actors put in over the summer and fall, and their commitment to their characters and the show. "They were just a joy to work with," she says.

The set design was done by David Pemberton, with lighting by U of I MFA student Raven Bouvier, complemented by fun, 1930s pre-show music. All in all, it was a charming evening of theatre for the Logos and broader Moscow community. ⊕

The JV squad had a very successful 6-0 season. Varsity ended the season at 9-2, going undefeated in league play for the league title and ending 3rd place in the state for the second straight year.

Coach Holloway says that the season highlights include, "Winning the White Pine League title for the second year and going undefeated in league; beating Kendrick at their place as they had a 41-game winning streak at that time; and despite losing to Kendrick in the state semifinals, I'm still proud

Cross Country

HIGH SCHOOL

With sixteen athletes, the high school cross-country team had a competitive and excellent season. Both the girls and boys were District Champions, and the boys were 2nd at the State Championship Meet in Eagle, Idaho.

The girls' team had five runners and that's all they needed to leave the district course with the championship trophy (all five finished in the top eighteen)! They ended the season crossing the finish line at State in a fierce storm: lightning, thunder, and pea-sized hail.

The boys' team did a tremendous amount of work in the preseason and easily won the district championship for the 7th year in a row, with five guys finishing in the top eleven. They went on to a very successful race at State, with all scorers

running faster on that course than they did weeks earlier at the Bob Firman race. Three boys medaled: junior **John Henry** (state runner-up) and seniors **Bear Lopez** (9th) and **Ethan Bremer** (17th) propelling their team to a second-place team trophy.

Zoe Doane (sophomore) and **Bear Lopez** (senior and team captain) received the Knight Award; **John Henry Crapuchettes** (junior) earned boys' MVP and was the District Champion and State Runner-up; and **Emma Darrah** (freshman and girls' MVP) was the District Champion and also medaled at state with a 12th-place finish.

John Henry, Ethan, and Emma each earned a spot in the 300 Summer Mile Club, Bear earned a place in the 500 Mile Club, and all four of them medaled at state, showing that all those preseason miles paid off in a big way!

Coach Paula Casebolt (Class of '94) was assisted by Tyler Anderson and said, "These athletes have an insatiable love for running and competing and most of them are already laser-focused on the upcoming track season. Combine that with their natural talent and some gifted

runners in next year's freshman class and things are looking bright for the future of Logos cross-country. As usual, there is family momentum happening: younger siblings are falling in love with the sport as they watch their brothers and sisters compete and they are eager to join them on the starting line. I love to see it!"

Alum Kayte Casebolt ('21), assisted by Otto Nielson, coached eighteen junior high runners through a very successful junior high cross-country season.
