

During AY 2025-26 the Rhetoric School (10-12th grade) students can earn elective credit for the following:

1. Logos School activities: Team Sports, Varsity Drama, Chamber Choir, and Mock Trial
2. Non-Logos School activities: Specifically, private music lessons, approved college courses, or private tutoring
3. Logos electives: Domestic Arts, Annual, Wrestling (2nd and 3rd quarters only), Athletic Trainer, Conditioning, PSAT Prep (Spring semester only)

**Schedule:** Electives are scheduled on Tuesday and Thursday, during 1st period (8:05-8:55), and during zero period (any day before 8:05 am as scheduled by the instructor.) Students who are in Logos activities or Non-Logos School activities will not be required to attend first period on Tuesday and Thursday but will attend their elective/activity according to their specific schedule. Students in zero period electives will attend according to the instructor for a minimum of two hours a week.

**Registration:** Students must register for electives during the designated registration period. Students who are rostered in an activity and want to use that activity for elective credit must state so during registration. Students electing to take private music lessons, a college course, or private tutoring must request it through the registrar's office no later than one week prior to the start of the semester. The principal will approve based upon the minimum number of hours required (30 per semester).

**Credit:** Students will receive .5 credits per semester of electives. Students must accumulate a minimum of two credits (4 semesters) worth of electives between 10-12th grade. Students participating in activities must participate in at least one activity during the semester in order to receive credit; winter activities (basketball and mock trial) will count for spring semester credit.

Students electing to take private music lessons or receiving private tutoring must submit a letter from their parents to the principal stating that they have completed a minimum of 2 hours a week of instruction per quarter in order to receive credit.

Students taking a college course must submit a certificate of completion or transcript to the principal to receive credit.
