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Faithful in the Little Things



2025 Valedictory Address, by Seamus Wilson

WELL. WE MADE IT. It's quite surprising actually. Fourteen years for some of us, a dozen for a few, and several years for many. But whatever year we joined this class doesn't matter now; we all have crossed the finish line and, in a few minutes, we will all—hopefully—successfully cross this stage to receive a piece of paper that proves our great accomplishment. Tens of thousands of homework assignments, dozens of papers, one or two choir productions, hundreds of games, matches, and meets, and at least one science experiment that involved two-liter bottles of soda, distance running, and some vomiting. And now, here we are. The class of 2025.

Now most reasonable people could look at this group and ask, “How did we do it?” How did a bunch of dorky kids who used to violently debate whether water is wet or whether hot dogs are sandwiches turn into young adults putting on armor to go out and face the world?

There are many ways you could answer that question, but one answer stands out to me as fitting to our class and classical education. Jesus tells us in Luke 16:10, “One who is faithful in a very little thing is also faithful in much.” That’s how we made it to this stage—by being faithful in the little things. We

were not the only shareholders in that faithfulness. Our parents and siblings, our teachers, our coaches, our pastors... so many played a role in educating this crew and getting us to this point.

Parents, you showed up every day. You packed lunches, edited papers, drove carpools, and reminded us to put our names on our assignments after the third pink slip came round when we were munchkins. The amount of unacknowledged blessings you parents have laid on us children is something we can never repay. You have created sparks

and tended them into flames. All of those “little” acts of faithfulness added up to something very big: a community that raised thirty more kids up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord.

Our entire education has been formed around the idea of faithfulness in the little things. In the elementary grammar stage, we were faithful in memorizing chants about Latin declensions and history timelines, singing songs of the kings of Israel, the US presidents, and the American inventors. Then, logic was at last introduced to a bunch of

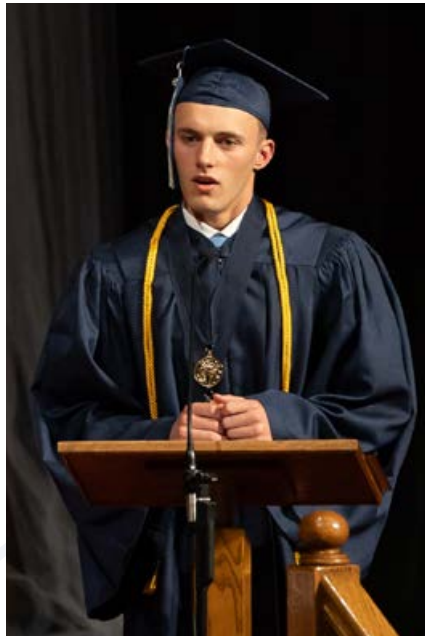


junior high rugrats, where we were very faithful to question everything—including whether Mr. Wilson’s jokes were actually funny (the answer to that question has never been settled). And lastly, in rhetoric we learned how to speak, to write, and—most importantly—how to dissect and listen. Those skills required a new kind of faithfulness.

All of this leads to a much larger point: we built those skills through faith, and we must apply those skills in faith that God is at work, writing a story, and we must have faith in the Creator in everything as he closes this chapter of our lives and starts the next one. Our journey doesn’t end now; it’s just getting started, so stretch out your hamstrings—Ben, especially you. Cliché much? Sure. But there’s nothing new under the sun. And this finish line is also a starting line.

Paul writes in Romans 12 that we are “one body in Christ, and individually members of one of another.” He then urges us to use the different gifts God has given us. Whether it be teaching, serving, encouraging, leading, he urges us to use them diligently. What we’ve learned here wasn’t just for thesis defenses and deep (or very shallow) philosophical discussions. It has prepared us to be parts of the body of Christ in a broken world.

We’re not all called to the same things. Some of us will go to college. Some will fail, content to be fans of Ohio State. Some will work. Some will leave town.

Some will stay close to home. A few of us will become engineers and doctors, and some might end up with jobs that haven’t even been invented yet. Whatever each one of us ends up doing, we

are members of one sacred body, with one objective—we are all called to glorify God and to enjoy Him forever.


Some will continue to be faithful. Some may not.


There were plenty of days over the course of this education when faithfulness and trust in the Lord felt just a little out of reach. Like the late study nights before a calculus final or the preparation for theses or classical history presentations. Or the times in 10th grade where we pretended that Latin vocab could be retained through the scientific process of osmosis, which, much to our dismay, doesn’t work.

But through those tough days, we learned another lesson, one that’s just as important: hope.

Romans 5:3-4 says, “We rejoice in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope.” Some of what we’ve endured in high school was actual suffering: boring assemblies, all-nighters where you start to see the sunrise, finals week, thesis presentations, 400 meters when you really don’t even want to run 300, juggling college recruitment with a no phone policy, trying to watch March Madness during school, and failing to make fire just like ancient man did—with a battery in physics class. Days of failure did not keep us from eventual success. All those trials taught us to endure, and through that endurance we gained something

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much deeper than just academic skill. We gained hope, not saccharine hope, not the hope of Disney fans. We gained grit and cursed determination. When the days were short and dark, and hope seemed lost, this senior class decorated the school in the middle of the night to celebrate the only true hope for this world, the Hope that came in Christ's birth. We gained the kind of hope that knuckles down and keeps brawling because the war has already been won.

That gritty hope is not the vague, Hallmark-movie hope that things will all work out if we just believe in ourselves. I'm talking about real, biblical hope—the kind that rests on the promises of God. Those promises never fail. That hope gives us what we need to keep moving when times get hard. The kind that says, no matter how uncertain the future looks, no matter what trials may come, Christ is risen, and our hope is secure. He already won.

Because of that glorious hope, there is no excuse for us to step into the crazy world and walk in fear and doubt. And yes, it's a confusing world. It's a world that calls good evil and evil good, a fallen world that says truth is subjective, identity is fluid, and meaning is optional.

But we have been given a better foundation. At Logos School, we were taught that truth is real. That beauty is worth pursuing. That goodness is not arbitrary. That the road to excellence is slick with sweat. And the good news is that Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever.

This doesn't mean we scatter out into the world screaming at everyone who stands against us. The gifts we have been given in this education and the knowledge that the victory has already been written should help us walk in humility. We serve. We build. We love. And we do it all not to make much of ourselves, but to make much of Christ.

So, to my classmates: thank you. Thank you for the laughter, the late-night study sessions, the junior high plays we all try not to talk about, the lack of expulsions when so many were possible. And for a sparkling, perfect, and unbroken Knights' Fest record. Thank you for singing loudly in choir even when off-key (sorry, Mr. Snell) and for arguing and debating week by week, making each other better. We've grown together, and I will never forget the last four years.

To our teachers: you were faithful in the little things. You graded endless stacks of papers, answered countless

questions—some of them ridiculous and some of them from Thomas. You taught us not only subjects but how to think, how to live, and how to love what is good. Thank you for being examples for us.

To our parents: thank you for everything. I know it's predictable, but it is true. For all of your sacrifices. For your prayers. For the car rides and late nights and lunches, even when we were fully capable of packing them ourselves. You have been our most faithful teachers. We owe you more than we could ever return. So, thank you.

And finally, to God be the glory. Every good thing we have learned, every step we've taken, every assignment completed or lost, every late night and early morning, every win and all those losses to Kendrick, has come from His hand. Thanks be to God.

And who knows—maybe someday we'll look back at this moment and think, “Wow... too bad we peaked in high school.” But I don't think so. I think the best is yet to come.

So, as we go out from here, be faithful in the little things. Remember that we are part of one body, with one mission, united by one hope. Let us live lives that point not to our personal success, but to the One who called us, shaped us, and gives us life and breath. He is sending us out to be a light in this dark world. The kind of light that comes from fire, tied to the tails of foxes, torching Philistine vineyards. We are being sent out to set this place on fire. So, class of 2025, let's get started. Thank you. ☪



The Best We Have Received

Excerpt of 2025 Salutatorian Address, by Cia Park

AS WE EAGERLY MAKE PLANS for the future (work, college, apparently having sixteen kids), it is tempting to forget the past. After all, it's done. It's over. We're starting a new chapter of our lives, and it's important to look forward, but, if there's anything we've learned from our teachers here at Logos, it's that it's just as important to look backward.

While I could wax philosophic about the trivium for half an hour, I will spare you and, instead, read a quote from Dr. Christopher Perrin which perfectly sums up the education we have been given: "Classical education turns out to be, at bottom, the love of our children to whom we give the best we have received."

"The best we have received" is truly a great description. A large part of classical education is about studying the masters. At Logos, we've been taught to read Homer and Aristotle, spent hours reading Lewis and Tolkien and Dickinson and Bradbury (and countless more hours reading Melville). We've studied scientific and mathematical laws and theorems that, in some cases, have taken centuries to form or discover. We've learned about some of the world's greatest and worst leaders, both past and present. We've studied the Bible in its entirety, not just vaguely as "Scriptures," but as real and living law and history and art. Some of the greatest knowledge that mankind has ever had

has been put by our parents and pastors and the staff of Logos School into our hands. It's pretty daunting.

There is another part of Dr. Perrin's quote, though, that is quite easy to miss. He says that "classical education [is] the love of our children." Essentially, what he's saying is that all of the education I've just talked about - all of this - would not be possible without the patience, the kindness, the dedication, and, of course, the love of all of you. In the end, it's love that truly defines our education. It's love that defines the immense and countless gifts that you all have given to us so freely for so many years.

But, of course, as the old Logos assembly saying goes, "We give gifts because He gave them first." Education is, in many ways, a gifting of knowledge from generation to generation. Yet, every piece of knowledge, every gift that mankind has ever received, has ultimately come



from God. So it is ultimately God we thank today and will continue to thank when, Lord willing, we give the best that we have received to our children. So, as we're looking forward toward our future, we'll be looking backward too, and, for the millionth time, we'll be saying "thank you." ☕



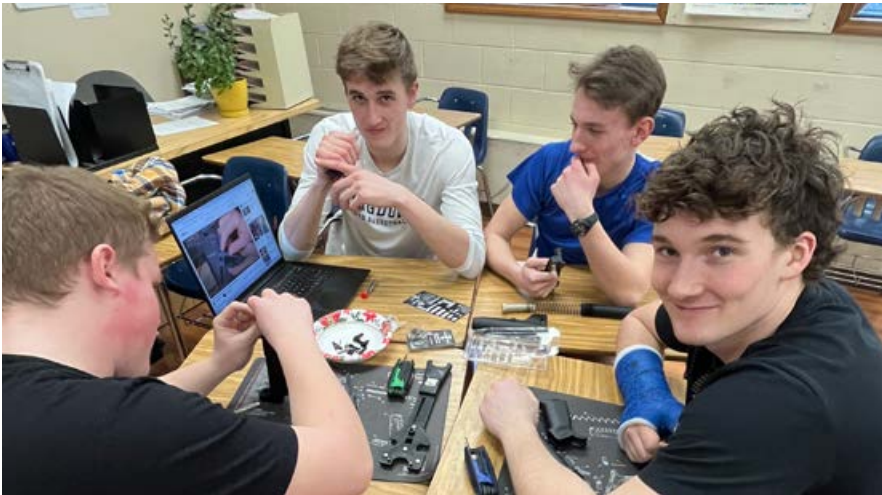


Knights' Fest 2025

Track

HIGH SCHOOL

There are two new banners hanging in the gym this summer thanks to the 2025 2A Girls and Boys State Champion teams! Head Coach Gwen Spencer was assisted by coaches Tyler Anderson, Caleb Wright, John Carnahan, Justin Spencer, Nate Wilson, Wayne Browning, Bridgid Monjure, and Betsy Becker in coaching 56 athletes to one of the most successful Logos track seasons since we won both championships ten years ago. They also won the White Pine League Championships and Regional/District 1 & 2.

Coach Spencer says: "It took sacrifice on the athletes' part to achieve the goals we had: sacrificing fast relays for points, sacrificing events for points in relays,

sacrificing evenings to get to practice at 5:45, sacrificing goals for the good of the team, sacrificing energy to run an 800, 4x100, and 400 within twenty minutes of each other, sacrificing a spot on a relay to get points, sacrificing listening to music on your airpods to obey coaches' team rule, basically sacrificing self for the good of the team. This sacrifice resulted in excellence as evidenced by our season: records broken, classification records set, PR's set, meets won, gold medals awarded, and banners captured. The gratitude exhibited by the athletes, parents, coaches, and fans was wonderful."

Senior Naomi Taylor and junior John Henry Crapuchettes led the teams at state, scoring 40 and 38 points, respectively. Individual top eight finishers included: 100: Naomi Taylor (1), Elizabeth Evans (4), Nate Monjure (7); 200: Naomi (1), Emily Bowen (4), Bethany Porras (8), Max Hawthorne (7), Asaph



Grieser (8); 110 and 300 hurdles: Ryan Daniels (1); 400: Naomi (1), Chloe Jankovic (2), Olaf Sundlie (4), Asaph Grieser (6), Baxter Covington (8); 800: Chloe Jankovic (1), Marisol Wilson (4), Lizzie Crawford (6), Seamus Wilson (1), John Henry Crapuchettes (2), Lucius Comis (6); 1600: Liv Rench (7), John Henry Crapuchettes (1), Max Grauke (7); 3200: Liv Rench (6), John Henry Crapuchettes (1); Discus: Tallis Comis (3), Thomas Bowen (1); Javelin: Jonathan Grauke (2), Thomas Bowen (3), Max Hawthorne (5); Shot Put: Thomas Bowen (1); Triple jump: Nate Monjure (3);

Medley relay: girls (1), boys (1); 4x100: girls (5), boys (3); 4x200: girls (1), boys (6); 4x400: girls (1), boys (1).

Two athletes also joined the 2-century club by earning 200 points in a season. Naomi Taylor (237 points) and Thomas Bowen (266.5) join just seven other Logos athletes in this club in thirty-three years of track competition.

Jes Brower received the Knight Award for his humble and sacrificial spirit. Coach Spencer says that "his attitude and actions are an exact representation of our motto: Gratitude, Sacrifice, Excellence."

JUNIOR HIGH

The future of Logos track is looking bright after an extremely successful junior high track season! Many school records were set this year and several athletes set multiple records: Lucy Points (400, 800, 1600, Long Jump); Quinn Covington (75m/100m/200m hurdles and multiple relays); Jerome Sentz (100, 200, 400, and Long Jump); and Truman Smith (100m/200m hurdles and multiple relays). Lucy and Jerome hold this year's fastest junior high times in the state, across all classifications, in the 1600 and 400, respectively. Sofie Church and Evie Farley became two of the three Logos girls ever to run a sub-6:00 1600 in 6th grade, and Sean McMurray set the 6th grade records in Shot Put and Discus.

Head Coach Rob Sentz was assisted by Isaac Grauke, Levi Wintz, Nick Studt, and Theo Sentz. Coach Sentz was especially impressed with this group of athletes and said, "Wherever we went the kids received constant compliments on how well they ran, jumped, and threw." Way to go, Knights!

HIGH SCHOOL BOYS

This year, the boys played the toughest schedule in the state of Idaho (2A) by a wide margin. They split regular season games with the eventual state champs (Kendrick) as well as splitting with the state runner-up (Kamiah). They battled against back-to-back 4A state champs (Bonners Ferry), also facing Washington state runner-up (Freeman) and even 6A Coeur d'Alene in a pair of tough road games.

The varsity squad of eight seniors (Jes Brower, Lucius Comis, Ryan Daniels, Gunnar Holloway, Bear Lopez, Ransom Sentz, Bo Whitling, and Seamus Wilson) and two sophomores (Baxter Covington and Nate Monjure) were coached by Nate Wilson, assisted by Dean and Scott Brunson. They finished the year at 16-10, and Coach Wilson

said: "We put together the toughest schedule possible, because I knew these guys wouldn't back down from anyone. They proved that right away by grabbing a summer league win over Moscow along with a dominant summer league victory over Clarkston. It would have been easy to play a normal 2A schedule and finish with 20+ wins, but these boys were eager to be challenged. I was incredibly proud of how they never quit and rose up in every battle, win or lose."

The boys achieved a second place finish in the White Pine League and ended the regular season ranked 3rd in the state. Multiple school records were set this season, including Single Season Rebounds (278) and Career Rebounds (629) by Lucius Comis, and Single Season Scoring (593) and Career Scoring (1631) by Seamus Wilson.

With the loss of eight seniors, next year's team will be bolstered by the young, successful JV squad, which was coached by Dean Brunson and assisted by Aaron Rench, Isaac Grauke, and Nick Holloway.

The junior high boys had a fun season. They split by grades, having both 7th and 8th grade teams, coached by Isaac Grauke and Rob Sentz. With 19 boys, the team has a solid future ahead of it. 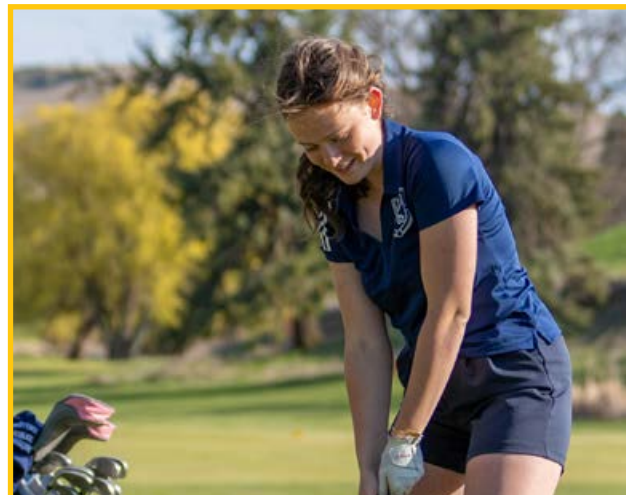
Golf

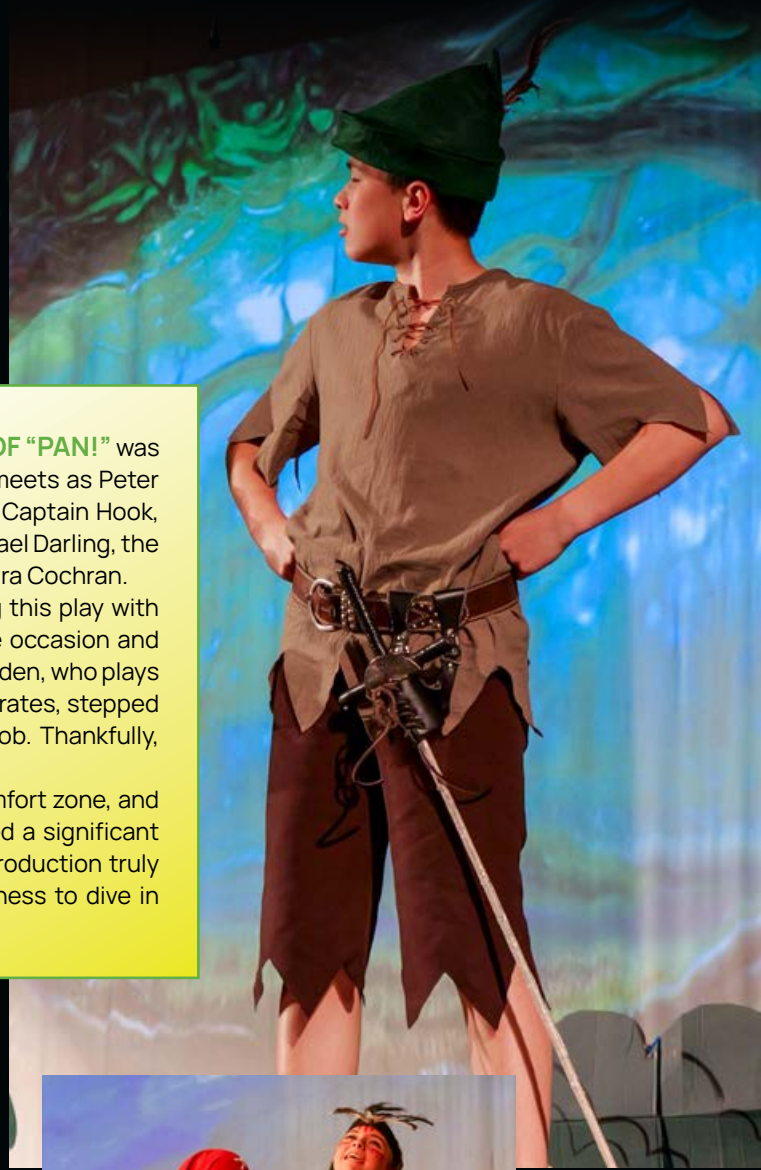


Pan!
